Behavioral Health Resources

- Seek further medical care for any increase in symptoms or new symptoms, such as thoughts of wanting to hurt yourself, hurt others, or if you have increased agitation.
- For immediate concerns, call 911 for emergency medical attention.
- Do not make changes to your medications, including taking more or less than prescribed, unless under the supervision of your provider. Be aware that some medications may make you feel worse if abruptly stopped.

• Mobile Crisis Team:

The Mobile Crisis Response Team provides a number of integrated services including:

- Evaluation of immediate need for crisis/emergency services (telephone triage)
- Crisis intervention and/or assistance in de-escalating the situation
- Risk assessment and evaluation for more intensive services
- Short-term crisis management until other supports/services are in place, or the crisis is resolved
- Liaison between individual, families, health care providers and emergency services
- Coordination of appropriate community-based services for ongoing treatment and follow up
